As such, members of the public may be recorded or photographed during the meeting. Anyone wishing to record or photograph the meeting must notify the Town Clerk before the commencement of the meeting.

### Public attendance at Council and committee meetings

As a public body, Northam Town Council understands the need for transparency and accountability. The Council will therefore seek to conduct meetings using practices and procedures set out within the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960, which states:

*Subject to subsection (2)\* below, any meeting of a body exercising public functions, being a body to which this Act applies, shall be open to the public.*

Subsection (2) states: *Where a meeting is open to the public, a body may, by resolution exclude the public from the meeting (whether during the whole or part of the proceedings) whenever publicity would be prejudicial to the public interest by reason of the confidential nature of the business to be transacted or for other special reasons stated in the resolution and arising from the nature of that business or of the proceedings; and where such a resolution is passed, this Act shall not require the meeting to be open to the public during proceedings to which the resolution applies.*

Therefore, the Council's policy is to allow public access to meetings unless the business being transacted is confidential or there are 'other special reasons' to exclude the public.

#### **Item 14 To consider part funding night buses**

Devon and Cornwall Police, in conjunction with District and Town Councils locally fund a night bus service on the 21 route (Ilfracombe to Westward Ho!), though the bus stops in Bideford after midnight (see copy of poster attached). North Devon, Torridge, Barnstaple, Bideford and Ilfracombe councils all provide funding towards the provision of the route. Enclosed is a confidential briefing from Devon and Cornwall police detailing.

This Council is asked if it would provide some funding towards the provision of a night bus route from Bideford to Westward Ho!. The Town Clerk understands that Ilfracombe Town Council provides a small fund per year (£500) to support this night bus service. Should this Council agree to assist in providing the service, the funding could come from the Youth Services budget

**Recommendation: The Council consider the proposal to provide a Night Bus service, providing the necessary funds.**

#### **Item 15 To consider the District Council's proposal for an examiner for the extra requirements of neighbourhood plans**

##### **Background:**

Following [the examination of the Northam Neighbourhood Plan](#), Torridge District Council (the District Council) received the [Examiner's report on 10 February 2026](#).

Prior to the District Council making a decision on whether the Northam Neighbourhood Plan (the Plan) should proceed to a referendum, the District Council is undertaking a focused public engagement exercise, seeking comments relating to any implications arising out of the recent changes to the legal compliance and Basic Conditions against which the Northam Neighbourhood Plan was examined.

##### Legal Changes

[The Levelling-up and Regeneration Act 2023 \(Commencement No. 11 and Saving and Transitional Provisions\) Regulations 2026](#), commence [sections 98](#) and [99](#) of the Levelling-up and Regeneration Act 2023, which came into effect on [25 March 2026](#).

These amend [Section 38C](#) of the [Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004](#) and [Paragraph 8\(2\), Schedule 4B](#) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 in respect of the legal compliance and the Basic Conditions requirements for neighbourhood plans.

In summary, the further legal compliance requirements are as follows:

- a) so far as the qualifying body considers appropriate, and having regard to the subject matter of the plan, the plan must be designed to secure that the development and use of land in the neighbourhood area contribute to the mitigation of, and adaptation to, climate change; and
- b) so far as the qualifying body considers appropriate and having regard to the subject matter of the plan, the plan must be designed to take account of any local nature recovery strategy under section 104 of the Environment Act 2021 that relates to all or part of the neighbourhood plan area.

In addition, there is a new Basic Condition requirement:

- c) the making of the neighbourhood development plan would not result in the development plan for the area of the authority proposing that less housing is provided by means of development taking place in that area than if the neighbourhood development plan were not to be made. Note: this replaces the former Basic Condition that the neighbourhood plan be in general conformity with the strategic policies contained in the development plan for the area (Basic Condition '(e)' is replaced by '(ea)').
- d) A further Basic Condition, '(fa)', related to the [new environmental assessment framework](#) is commenced albeit, until such time as a completed framework for the implementation of Environmental Assessment Reports is in place, compliance with this Basic Condition cannot be assessed.

#### **Next steps:**

The District Council has notified this council of its intention to commence the focused consultation on the 16<sup>th</sup> April. An addendum to the Examiner's report is also required. To engage the Examiner for this work, the District Council requires the approval of this Council. There is no financial implication for this council.

#### **Effect of the changes:**

The further examination of the Northam Neighbourhood Plan means it will be presented to the June 2026 meeting of the District Council for adoption and approval to proceed to referendum.

**Recommendation: The Council approve the engagement of the same Examiner that carried out the previous examination of the Northam Neighbourhood Plan , Andrew Mead at IPE.**
