## 1 Respective responsibilities of the body and the auditor

#### 2 External auditor report 2020/21

Except for the matters reported below, on the basis of our review of Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR), in our opinion the information in Sections 1 and 2 of the AGAR is in accordance with Proper Practices and no other matters have come to our attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.

The AGAR was not accurately completed before submission for review. Please ensure that amendments are corrected in the prior year comparatives when completing next year's AGAR.:

- Unpaid direct debits as at the year end have been incorrectly included as reconciling items in the bank reconciliation. The figure in Section 2, Box 8 should read £446,533.
- The figures in Section 2 for 2019/20 includes transactions in respect of Northam Burrows Charity. This was reported in last year's
  external auditor report. The figures have not been restated. Last year the smaller authority confirmed it was working to determine the
  legal status but we have not been provided with confirmation of the outcome. It is therefore not possible to determine whether the
  current year figures include or exclude trust fund transactions. Please consider the treatment and effect of such advice when preparing

Other matters not affecting our opinion which we draw to the attention of the authority:

The smaller authority has confirmed that it has not complied with the governance assertions in Section 1, Boxes 3 and 4, but it has provided the appointed auditor with an adequate explanation for non-compliance and details of the actions necessary to address weaknesses identified.

The smaller authority has not provided:

an adequate explanation as to why the trust fund entries in Section 1, Box 9 and Section 2, Box 11 of the AGAR vary from the entries
in the prior year final signed Annual Return
